SCHOOL HOURS

Please be advised that school starts at 07:48 and closes at 14:00. Latecomers cause disruption in the class, and if a learner is persistently late, detention will be given to the learner. If latecoming still continues, a meeting with the school Governing Body and the parent/guardian will be held to discuss the matter and further action will be taken.

SCHOOL HOURS FOR GRADE ONE LEARNERS:

- School will end at 13:00 for all grade one learners from 09th January to 25th January.
- As from Monday 28th January onwards school will end at 14:00 for all learners.

SCHOOL BAGS

Grade 1, 2 and 3 learners

A large firm plastic "box style" suitcase is acceptable. No stickers or graffiti are allowed on school bags.

Grade 4 to Grade 7 learners

It is compulsory for our senior learners to use the Dinwiddie Primary School suitcase which is available from Ebsons in Germiston and Simply School at the New Market mall in Alberton. Please ensure that your child's name is clearly visible on the front of the suitcase, where space is provided to write your childs' name.

MONEY MATTERS

Please note that the school is not allowed to lend children money for transport, tuckshop etc. To avoid disappointment, please ensure that your children have the correct money with them on the day.

WEEKLY NEWSLETTER

The weekly newsletter goes out every Thursday during the school term

Many parents/guardians do not receive these letters which contain important dates and provide information about events and programmes pertaining to the school.

Please take note that in future:

- Learners with tablets will no longer receive a printed Newsletter as it will be loaded onto the tablet every Thursday.
- Learners with no tablets will still receive a printed copy (as in the past).

MEDICINES

Due to the sensitive issue of handing out medicines please be advised that the school will not hand out medicine to your child. If they do change in the future, please update the school.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

PE is part of the school curriculum and all learners are expected to participate.

A learner will only be excused from PE on presentation of a medical certificate. Learners must wear the official school PE uniform when doing PE (black shorts and house T-shirt).

The PE uniform is also used for athletic practices and other sporting activities as well as life orientation lessons and arts and culture lessons. The house T-shirts are available from the school office at a cost of R120 each.

LEARNERS WAITING FOR LIFTS / TRANSPORT

To ensure the safety of all learners, all gates other than the



one at the waiting area (next to the grandstand) will be locked at 14:15. Any learner not collected before this time must be collected at the waiting area. This ruling also applies to learners who stay for extramural activities.

Parents please assist us by:

- Ensuring that proper arrangements are in place to have your child/children collected promptly from the waiting area at the close of school.
- Speaking to your child/children about proper behaviour while they wait.
- Telling your child <u>not</u> to go home with a friend or anyone else unless previously arranged.

NB: The waiting area is <u>not</u> an aftercare facility. Learners may not be left unattended after 14:30 as there is no teacher on duty. The school will not take responsibility for the safety of learners after school hours.

The Governing Body <u>ruling is that learners</u> will not be allowed in the waiting area or school grounds after 15h30 once extra murals are completed.

The school gates and waiting area will be locked and the learners will be sent out. Therefore, please take responsibility for your child and make proper arrangements for his/her safety after school by ensuring that your child is collected on time after school. If he/she is participating in an extra mural activity, the collection time is at 15:30.
